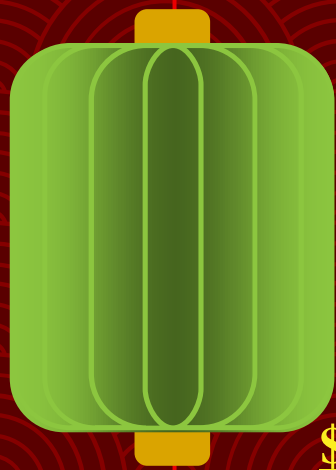


Moon Cakes
